

## National lockdown restrictions



**Central Government decided on January 4 England will be in [national lockdown restrictions](#) until further notice.**

This replaced the previous Tier 4 update of December 30.

You must stay at home. The single most important action we can all take is to stay at home to protect the NHS and save lives.

Residents cannot leave or be outside of the place they are living unless they have a reasonable excuse.
