

Cropwell Bishop Parish Council Children's Path Games Questionnaire Update 1

Your Opinion Matters!

Thank-you to the 119 residents who responded to our questionnaire which is approximately 8% of our population aged over 18 years old. Most submissions were received electronically with 13 paper responses returned from the Cropwell Bishop News.

The questionnaire responses indicate that there is positive support to progress the children's path games. Thank-you to those that took the time to provide comments in the form of ideas to enhance the idea, making observations and flagging potential concerns. It was noted there were a small number of submissions with strong views why this project should not go ahead. All comments will be looked at in more detail by the Parish Council.

Initial Analysis of Data

All statistics are taken from the base of 119 residents:

- 82% support or strongly support this potential project
- 15% of responses were received from Cooper, Brownhill and Newberry Close residents
- A 50/50 response split between those with children under 11 and those that do not
- 87% submitted a justification for a score and/or made additional comment
- 89% use the green open amenity space behind Cooper, Brownhill and Newberry Closes

- 18% provided their contact details to take part in a subsequent virtual/phone interview
- 100% of those who provided contact details are supportive of the development of this project

The following statistics are taken from subsets of the data:

- 56% of responses received from Cooper, Brownhill and Newberry Close residents supported or strongly supported
- 33% of responses received from Cooper, Brownhill and Newberry Close residents definitely do not support
- 17% of responses received from Cooper, Brownhill and Newberry Close residents provided their contact details
- Of the base population, those with children under 11 who use the green open amenity space – 94% supported or strongly supported
- Of the base population, with children under 11 who did not use the green open amenity space – 29% were not supportive of a change
- Of those with no children under 11 and who use the green open space – 70% were supportive of the inclusion of children's path games

Next Steps

1. The Parish Council resolved that the researcher progress with the virtual/phone interviews at its September meeting
2. To progress a discussion with the landowner, on its receptiveness to allow such a project
3. To seek design advice and initial costings
4. A progress update to be placed before the Parish Council's October meeting
